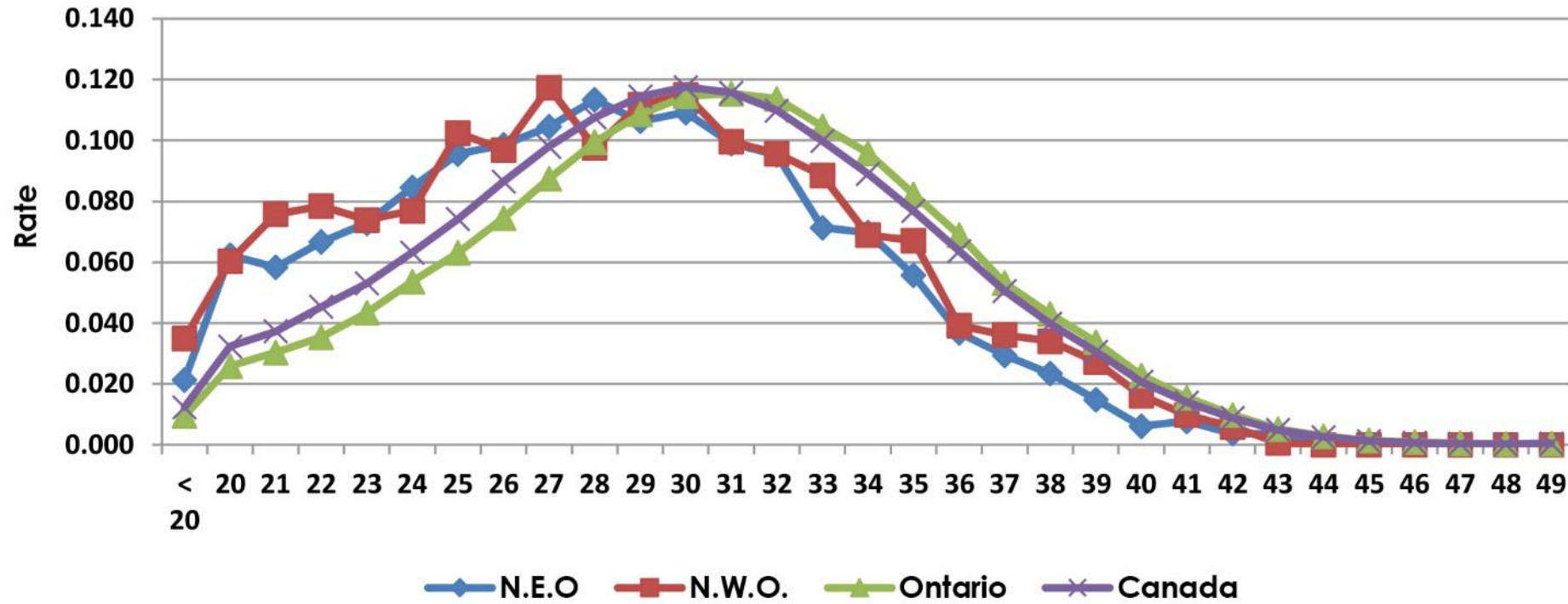

Average Fertility by Age, 2011



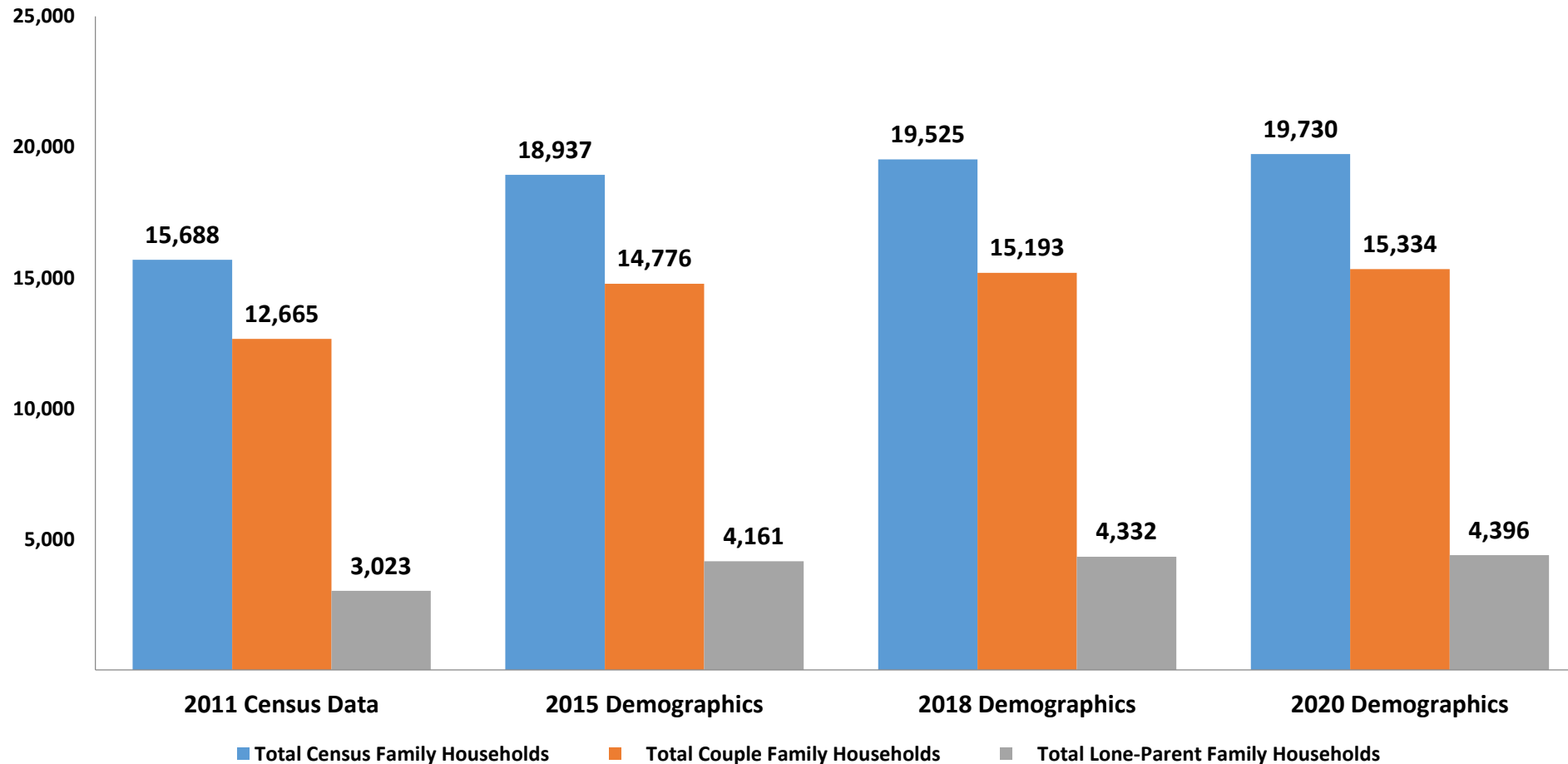

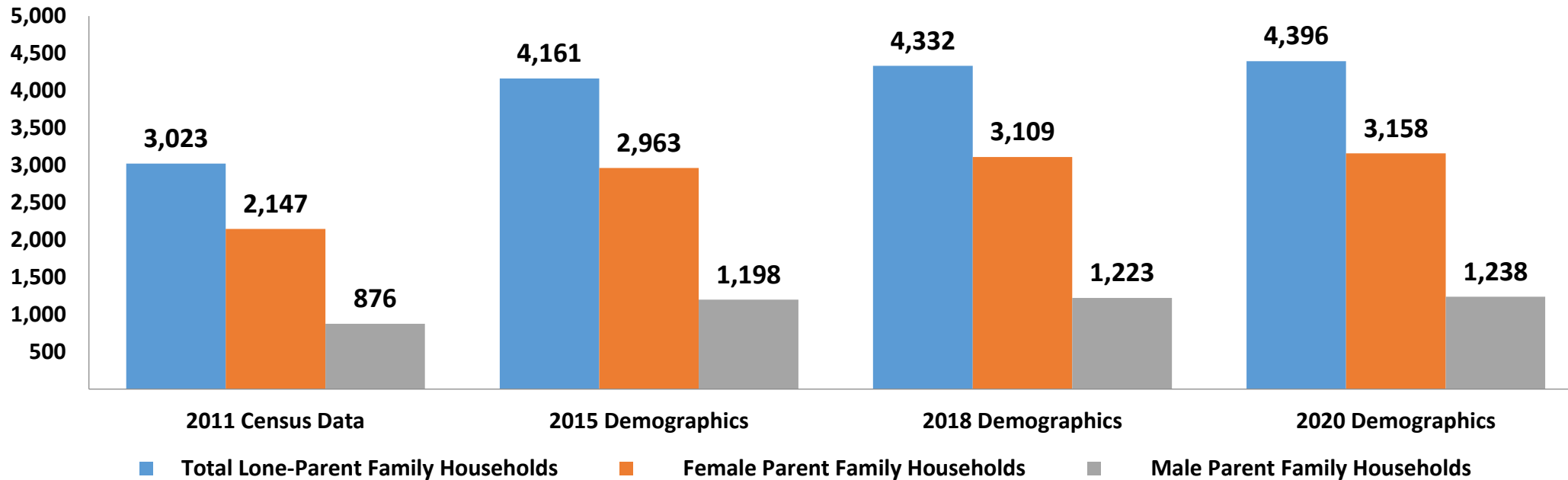

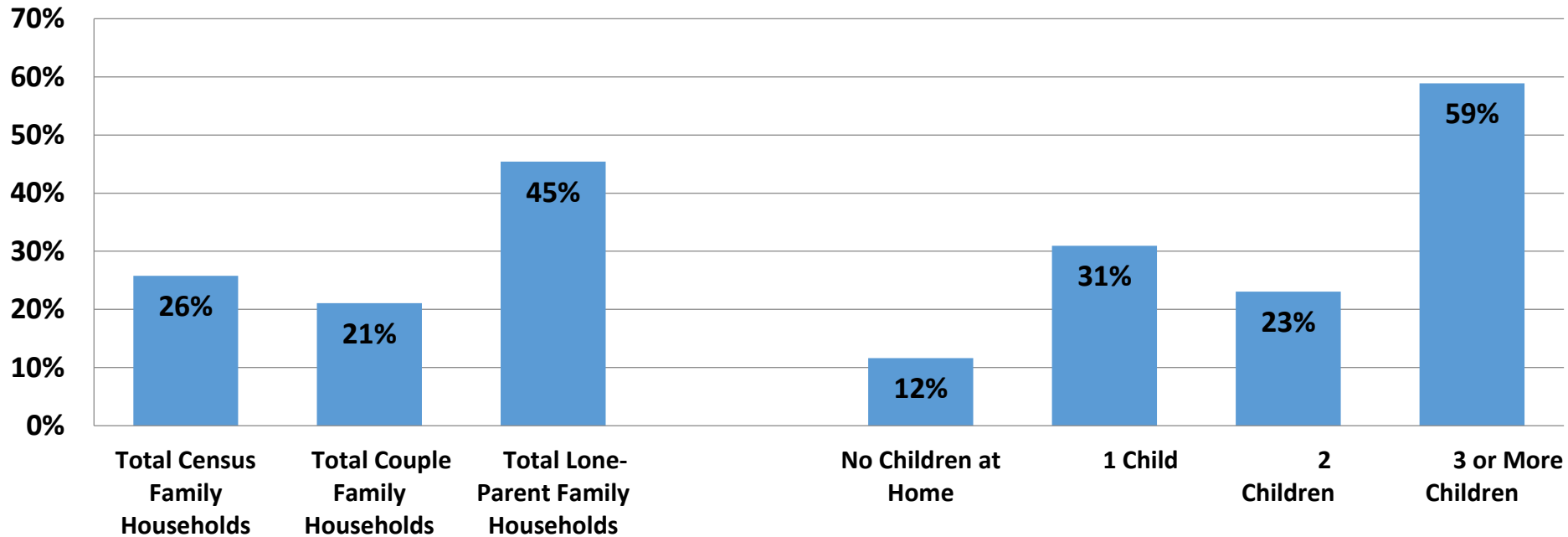

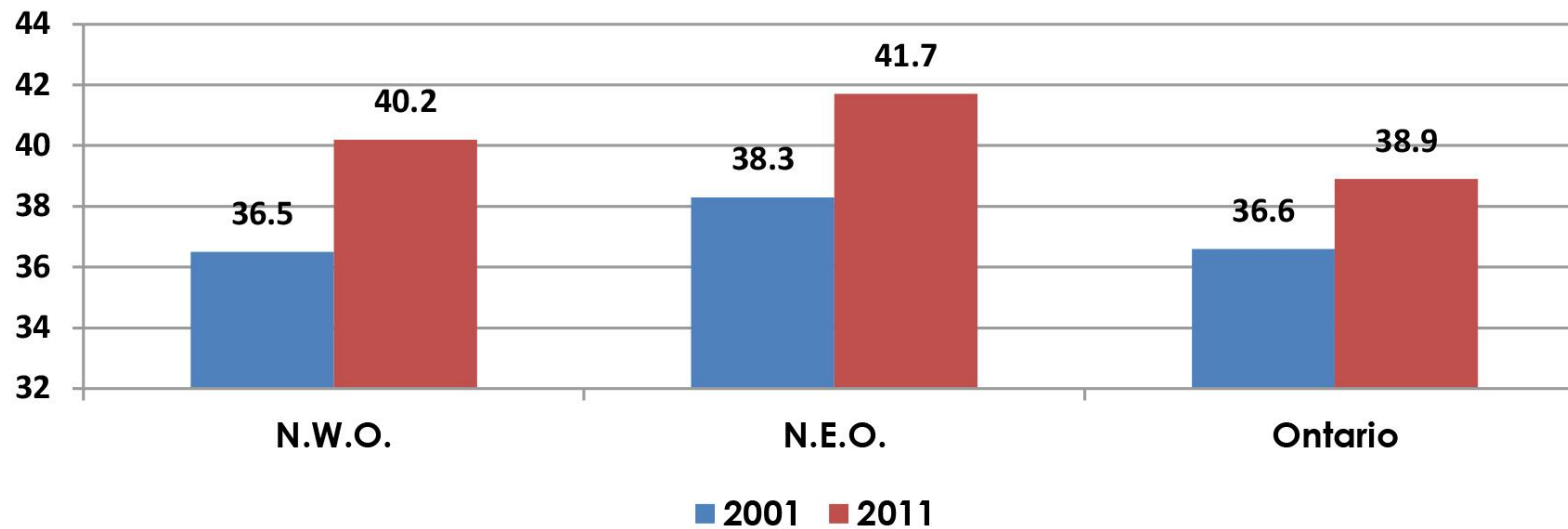

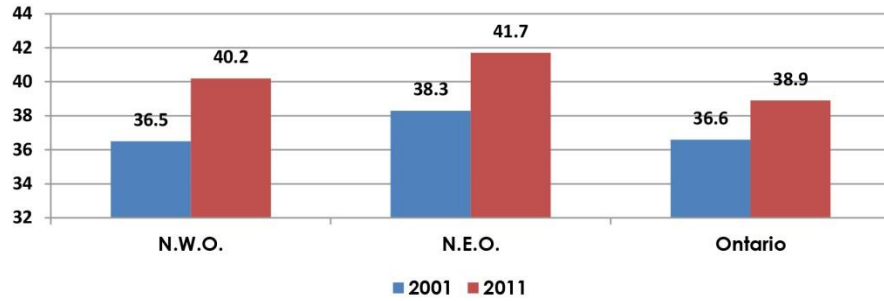

Average Age Changes 2001-2011



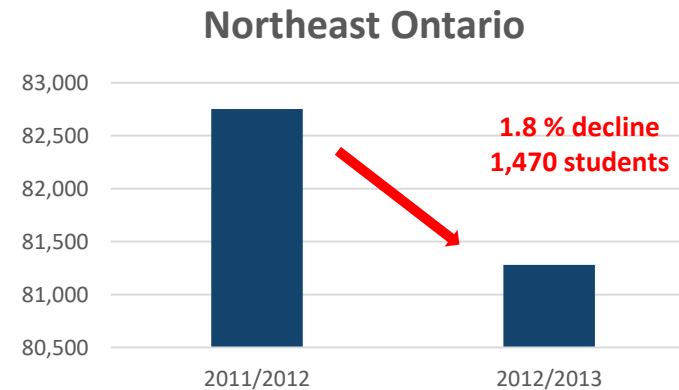
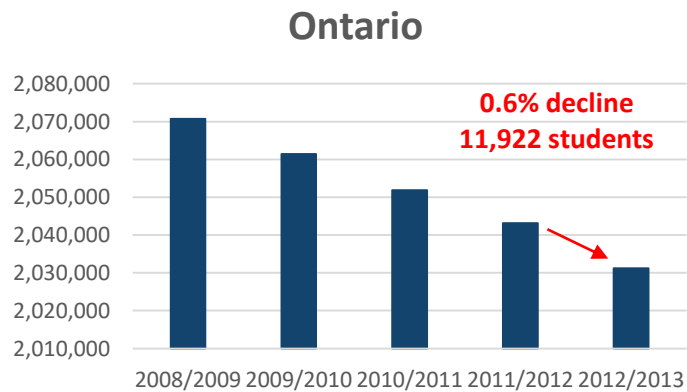
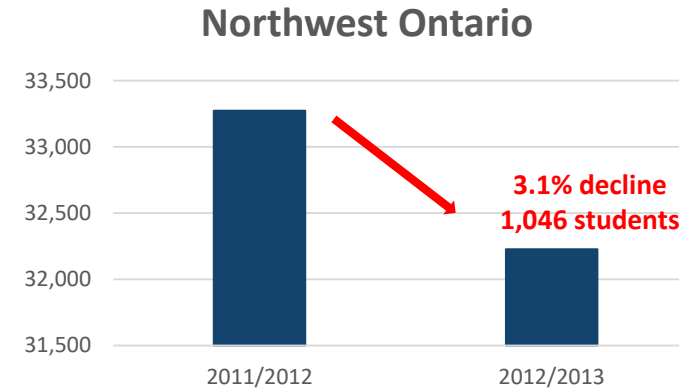
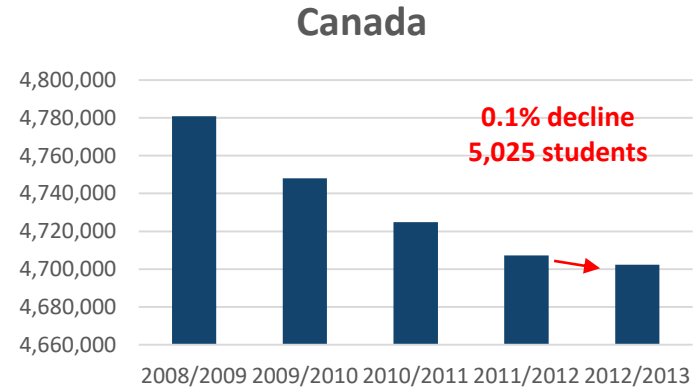

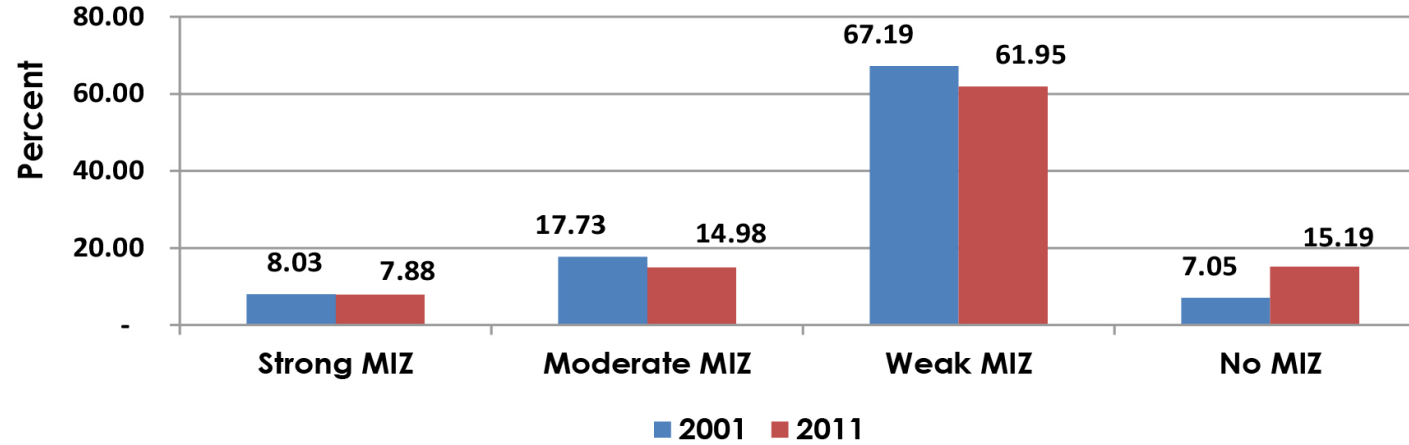

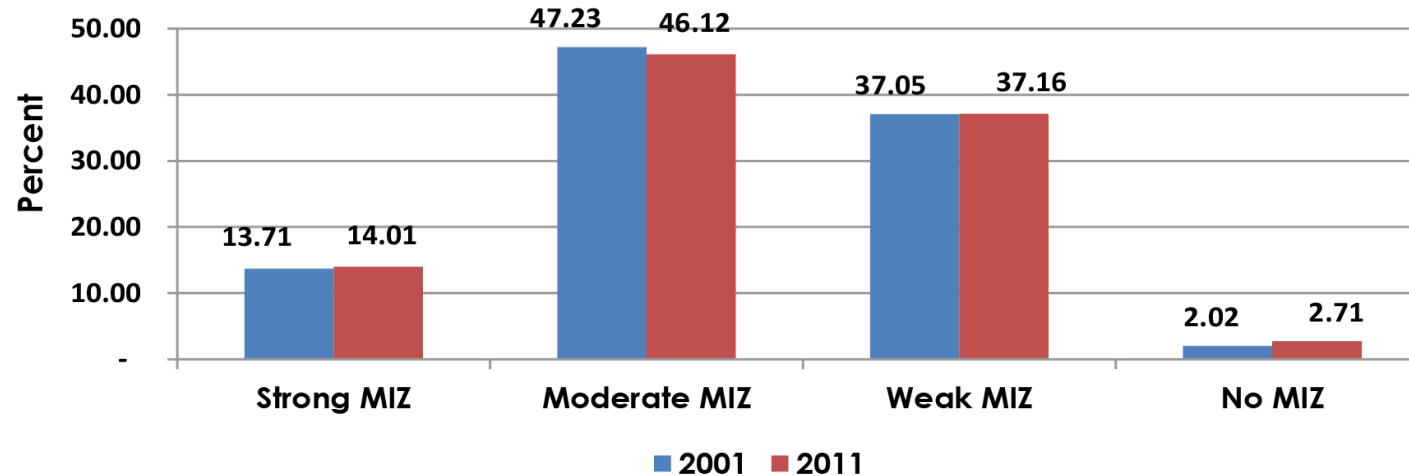
